

# OP7 Social Inclusion: support to indigenous peoples (IPs)

Social inclusion, particularly empowerment of women, indigenous peoples, youth and people with disabilities, is mainstreamed and enhanced in SGP initiatives on environment and livelihood improvement

At least 20% of relevant SGP country programs globally include targeted support for Indigenous Peoples

Guidelines and best practices generated from SGP projects on engagement with women, indigenous peoples, youth and persons with disabilities are widely shared



# OP7 strengthen work with IPs on traditional knowledge (TK)



Support to IPLCs) on protection and transmission of traditional knowledge

2019 global review of IPs engagement : 30% of portfolio in 90 countries with IPs

SGP baseline: over 650 projects on TK supported in some 110 countries around the world

2019 Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES): combination of TK and western science as co-equal 'knowledge systems'
